



The Hon Ian Holloway PC CD KC PhD LLD

Dr Ian Holloway is currently completing his term as the Dean of Law at the University of Calgary. He is the longest-serving law dean in modern Canadian history, and is also the longest-serving law dean in North America. After service in the Air and Sea Cadets, he joined the Navy as a Signaller at HMCS Brunswicker, and subsequently served as a Chief Petty Officer in HMCS Scotian and HMCS Carleton before transferring to, and taking a commission in, the Royal Australian Navy. He retired from naval service in 2002, after a career of 25 years. Ian holds a distinction that is probably unique in Commonwealth navies today, in that he served at sea as a Yeoman/Chief Yeoman of Signals to commanding officers from and including every rank from Lieutenant to Vice Admiral. He is the author of *Self Reliance Through Service*, the official history of HMCS *Scotian*, and was one of the editors of *Our Sailors, Our Stories, Scotian's* contribution to the naval reserve centennial. He was also one of the contributors to *Citizen Sailors: Chronicles of Canada's Naval Reserve, 1910 – 2010* (Gimblett and Hadley, eds). In 2015, Ian was made a member of the King's Privy Council for Canada, when he was appointed to the Security Intelligence Review Committee, where he served for 8 years.
